On behalf of the members of the Veterans Education Project (VEP), which represents the interests and concerns of well over one million members of the Army and Air National Guard, their family members, National Guard retirees, and survivors, we are pleased to offer our support for S. 2327, the *TEA Act*.

The Department of Defense's recent changes to the transferability of the Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits has confused and frustrated Servicemembers who wish to transfer this education benefits to their families. Unfortunately, many Servicemembers and Veterans are unable to transfer their education benefits because of a technicality or miscommunication, financially distressing military families who believed in the promise of the Post-9/11 GI Bill. S. 2327, the *TEA Act*, will ensure that our nation's Servicemembers and Veterans are able to transfer their Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to their families.

VEP Executive Director Daniel Elkins explained that, "The men and women that protect our way of life often do not come from generational wealth, and they have earned the right to pass on what they have earned to their family."
