## **Veterans Education Project Applauds Committee Advancement of H.R. 3767: HPSP Improvement Act of 2025**

Washington, D.C. – The Veterans Education Project (VEP) commends the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs for advancing H.R. 3767, the Health Professionals Scholarship Program (HPSP) Improvement Act of 2025, to the full House for consideration. The bipartisan legislation, introduced by Representatives Abraham Hamadeh (AZ-08) and Nikki Budzinski (IL-13), strengthens a vital education-to-employment pipeline for veterans while addressing persistent staffing shortages across the VA healthcare system.

HPSP provides educational scholarships to veterans pursuing careers in healthcare and places them in full-time positions at VA medical centers upon completion of their degrees. H.R. 3767 builds on this foundation by requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs to finalize full-time employment contracts for HPSP participants within 90 days of graduation. This added measure ensures smoother transitions, program stability, and greater continuity of care for veterans nationwide.

"HPSP serves both veterans and the VA health system by investing in a workforce that understands the unique needs of those they care for," said Donald Franklin, Executive Director of the Veterans Education Project. "This legislation is a smart and timely update to a critical program that helps student veterans enter meaningful careers while directly improving services for their fellow veterans."

VEP thanks **Chairman Mike Bost (R-IL)** and **Ranking Member Mark Takano (D-CA)** for their leadership in moving this legislation forward and urges the full House to pass it swiftly.
